Exchange currency only at authorized exchange houses or at your hotel



Inside the bank, remember to make cash transactions only with the tellers.



Try to use ATMs located at shopping centers or other commercial establishments.



After your purchase, keep your documentation (ID card, passport, credit cards) at all times.



Avoid receiving help from strangers



You can support waiters, chefs and service personnel of bars and restaurants when you visit with a voluntary tip of 10% on your bill. The establishment should always ask you if you want to include this tip in your bill.

Bogotá's weather is unpredictable, and the rain can come at any time. Nights are always cold.



Bogotá has different tourist transportation services, such as yellow taxis and white cars (a premium private service). The white car service can be booked at hotels and agencies.

Always request your taxi service by phone or using mobile applications.

All yellow taxis must display a Fare rate card (fare per unit of distance) with the driver's identification, picture of the driver, and taxi's license plate.

CYCLE THE CITY

With 540 km of bike paths, Bogotá is one of the World's Biking Capitals. Every Sunday, Bogotá closes over 120 km of its vehicular roads to make way for thousands of people using their bikes, jogging, walking, or skating.
